Sue also informed us that NIU's Circle K will induct their new officers tonight at their meeting in DuSable Hall 256. This is an Interclub; they'll be passing the gavel to us.

John Rey announced that he'll be collecting children's books at our meeting next Wednesday, in preparation for donating new stocked bookshelves to 50 more children in our community.

Gary Vander Meer is hoping to recruit one more volunteer to help at Breakfast with a Bunny at Hopkins Park on Sunday, April 12, from 9:00 until noon.

Lieutenant Governor Jean Erlenhorn shared news about our Sycamore club's recent donation to the Sycamore Fire Department.

The "Ben's Blue Bags" program was established by Captain/Paramedic Matt Kodicek of the Crown Point Fire Department in Crown Point, Indiana, whose son Ben is on the autism spectrum. These bags contain sensory stimulation items that help First Responders calm patients with autism and special needs during over-stimulating emergency situations. Each bag includes a dry-erase board, pictogram, markers, squeeze balls, rubber worms, a marble mesh, Rubik's Cube, bendy bracelet, and ear muffs (to help deaden sounds). These items help with communication and help soothe patients during a crisis. The Sycamore Club raised money to supply 8 new bags.

Toney Xidis reminded us that he'd like to hold a Mardi Gras brainstorming session next Thursday, March 27. This year's celebration at Faranda's netted \$2100.

Program

DeKalb Mayor Cohen Barnes visited the club today and updated us on a number of projects including an update on the Kraft/Heinz building which suffered foundation faults that needed to be replaced and the addition of a rail spur line onto the property. The building is now expected to open in 2027.

The Amazon building has been completed but it has been mothballed until the company needs to put it into operation.

The roundabout near the Ellwood House and Clinton Rosette Middle School was again addressed with Mayor Barnes stressing that safety is a prime concern and that a dedicated crossing will be installed just North of the roundabout.

DeKalb now has its largest police force in history, and the new fire station near Schnucks will allow equal response times all over town.

Thanks to the tremendous growth in industrial parks, the tax rate for city residents has been reduced from 11.5% to just 8.1%.
