He'd like to hold a Community Service meeting in two weeks, after our May 28th lunch session. Tonight, Gary will present our club's Barry Haber Scholarship during an awards ceremony at DeKalb High School.

Ken Doubler asked for a motion to formally approve of our slate of officers and board members for the coming year. Motion was made by Shadow Gentry, seconded by Bob Hadley, and approved by acclamation.

Jim Barker asked to hold a Program Committee meeting BEFORE next Wednesday's noon gathering AT 11:30, on May 21. This is a change from what was originally announced.

PROGRAM

Sean Frazier, NIU's longtime athletic director, was our guest speaker. He began by thanking the wider community for all of the warmth they've shown him and his family over the last 12 years.

Director Frazier outlined how the landscape has changed for college sports, now that student athletes are able to monetize their name, image, and likeness as never before. More and more star players are utilizing the transfer portal, in search of better offers and more media coverage.

Colleges are learning to cope with these new challenges. NIU's decision to move its football program from the MAC Conference to the Mountain West — which takes effect in 2026 — is one way to capture more revenue. Other schools (both the Army and Navy academies, for instance) have had success playing football against top-tier teams, while their other sports teams compete in more regional conferences.

Thanks to the rising costs of college athletics nationwide, team rosters will have to be pared. Football, for one, will be reduced from 120 team members to 105 next season. Each sport will have its own limit.

Director Frazier fielded questions about the very real risks of sports gambling by players, and possible upgrades for Huskie Stadium. In the future, he hopes that teams fly in and out of DeKalb's airport rather than book flights through Rockford.
